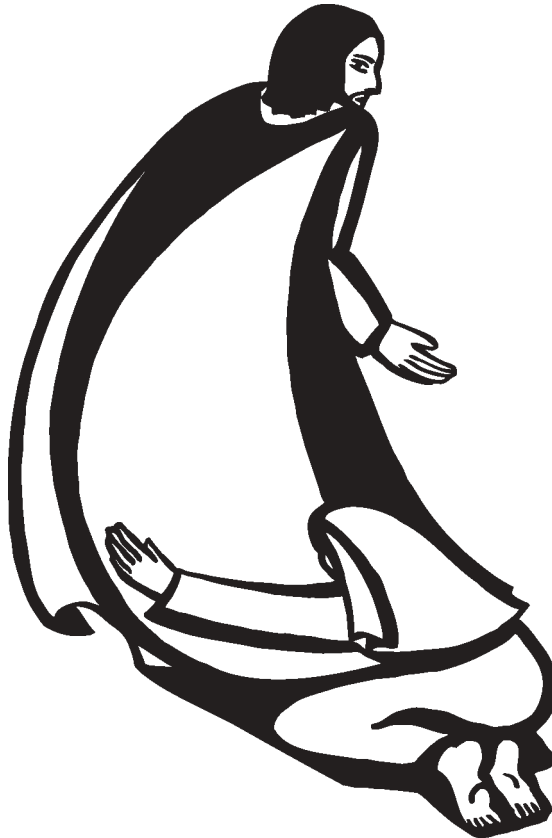

THIRD SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST [PROPER 5]

Today's readings invite us to a solid foundation for the building up of the church and of Christians: the rock of Jesus' words, the ground of faith.
